

Slap Card Game

Rules:

1. There will be a table filled with index cards with the picture of the bird.
2. There should be at least 5 people playing at once
3. Before we start, your hands will have to be behind your back, and you can't hover over the cards.
4. We will call out the name of the bird, and the people will have to find the bird before anyone else. When you find it, slap it as fast as you can before anyone else.
5. If you get the name of the bird correctly, then you get to keep the card and it will equal to 1 point.
6. If you slap the wrong card, there will still be a chance for you and the others to slap the right card
7. **The object of the game is to get as many cards as you can before anyone (also to not slap the wrong card)**
8. If there is more than one hand on the card and everyone went for it at once, then whoever's hand is on the card first gets it (Like there are many hands and whoever's hand is on the bottom touching the card, that person will get the card.)
9. . If one person touched the edge, and another person slaps their hand in the middle, then they both do rock paper scissors. Whoever wins gets the card. Like there are many hands and whoever's hand is on the bottom touching the card, that person will get the card.
10. If you slap the wrong card, then you will have to forfeit a card that you got and the card will be back in the round.
11. The round will end when there are no more cards left on the table
12. At least 1 or 2 rounds, and at the end of each round, we will count all of the cards that each person has.

- Index cards - **regular size (24 of the index cards)**
- Paper printed of the Hawaiian Birds - **same size as index cards**
- Glue Stick
- Another paper with the names of the birds so we call the names and a picture of what the bird looks like so we can call it out






